Construction at leləm is proceeding per schedule with safety procedures in place to address COVID-19 conditions. Phase I of the leləm Village and Cedar Walk, by Polygon is scheduled to be completed in 2022. The leləm Village will have 3 buildings, with a grocery store and retail units. There is a 5-storey building with 62 below market units with the grocery store anchor, a 12-storey building with 87 market residential rental units and a 4-storey building with 24 market residential rental units and commercial retail units below. The leased land to Polygon who are building Cedar Walk, has also reached 95% presale with just a few units left to be sold. The Sales Centre is currently only open by appointment. For the next phase, the development permit has been submitted for Parcels L&M townhouse complex. The development contains 168 apartments, 8 city homes and 58 townhomes. The Sales Centre for Parcels L&M is planned to open in Fall 2021. Both the Polygon projects are on a 99-year land lease.

There are a total of 18 public art opportunities, exclusive to Musqueam members only at leləm. MCC is working with Ballard Fine Art Consultants who facilitated the selection process with the leləm Art Committee. Artists/Artist Teams have been selected and are now finalizing their art work with the design teams. Artists which have been selected are:

Kelly Cannell, Summer Cannell, Thomas Cannell, Susan Point, Brent Sparrow, Chris Sparrow, Chrystal Sparrow, Debra Sparrow, Robyn Sparrow, and Gracielene Ulu. Please watch for future updates on revealing their artwork and designs!

SHALIMAR PLACE TOWNHOME COMPLEX:

Thank you to each band member who submitted their artwork to our call for Expressions of Interest for the Shalimar Place Townhome Complex Logo Design. Darryl Blyth's design has been the selected artist for this project. Darryl will be working with our team to finalize his design. We are targeting the end of Summer for the new signs to be installed.

Artist Bio:

My name is Darryl Blyth. I am a member of the Musqueam Indian Band. My mother is Susie Blyth and my grandmother is Helen Callbreath "Auntie Honey." For as long as I can remember I have always been an artist. I've also kept drawing for fun but now I get to do it professionally. Normally I do commercial artwork and logos, but sometimes I get to do fun illustrations. It is really exciting for me to get the opportunity to do art for Musqueam and get in touch with my roots doing indigenous artwork. This is one of the first pieces I have done in this style so I am looking forward to more opportunities to create indigenous art for my community.

UNIVERSITY GOLF COURSE (UGC):

This past winter (Jan - March 2021) and spring (April - June 2021), have been extremely busy for UGC. With COVID travel & gathering restrictions remaining in-place for most of the Province of BC, golf remained one of the few things which people were allowed to participate in. This produced heavy demand for the amount of play, practice and lessons, by the local Vancouver population. UGC witnessed record levels of 'rounds played' in all of these months.

The same could not be said for the Food & Beverage part of the golf course operations. The COVID restrictions which remained in-place for indoor dining and gatherings (events, meetings, weddings), meant that customers were limited to outdoor patio dining or take-away for their food needs. As the Province moves into "Step 3" (July 1) and "Step 4" (Sept 7), we are hopeful



that our Food & Beverage operations can return to a more robust traffic flow/business.



MUSQUEAM GOLF & LEARNING ACADEMY (MGLA):

Very similar to the golf operations at UGC, MGLA witnessed very brisk business for their Golf Operations (Practice Range, Lessons, Golf Course) over the past winter (Jan-March) & spring (Apr-June). Monthly traffic flow during these months was the most we've witnessed at MGLA, for many seasons.

Again, as was the case at UGC, the Clubhouse and Restaurant Operations at MGLA, were negatively impacted by the Provincial Health Orders over these same months. With the details laid out in the Province's "BC Restart Plan", we have already expanded operations and look forward to being fully back to normal by fall.



MILLTOWN MARINA:

The business of the Marina, for the most part has been steady throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, experiencing only a slightly negative impact to dock lift revenues. The build out of the dry stack expansion was also delayed because of the pandemic, but the project is now in progress and will result in increased capacity to drive further revenues from that facility. Although the past year saw some challenges, the Marina has done well by



even outperforming the prior year and continued success can be expected as we look toward the future.

MCC BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT UPDATES

MCC Business Development continues to successfully work with Crown Corporations and Industry firms to assist with fulfilling the commitments as laid out in the MIB relationship agreements. We also conduct business development on new opportunities outside of Musqueam relationship agreements

One of our objectives is to work closely with the Musqueam Member Owned Businesses (MOBS) helping to establish or grow their business models. If you currently have a business we encourage you to register with MCC through Sandra Fossella by email sfossella@musqueamcapital.ca.

Currently we are collaborating with the MIB Intergovernmental Affairs (IGA) department as well as BC Hydro on the Business Development Fund intended to assist with MOB's obtaining contracts with BC Hydro.
